Tour the museum housing thousands of items which were unearthed at this 400 year old site</p> <p>Dinner</p> <p>Hotel check-in</p> <p>Evening Program* "Lantern Tour" – Take a nighttime introductory walking tour in Colonial Williamsburg. This hands-on exploration provides students with clues leading them to various colonial trade shops. Collaborate and think creatively to solve each clue and then enter the trade shops to participate in re-enactments and learn about everyday life in 18th-century Williamsburg</p> <p>Lunch</p> <p>Colonial Williamsburg Study Visit Continued – Participate in Revolutionary City, an interactive "street theatre," visit Great Hopes Plantation, a "middling" farm, and experience different aspects of colonial life as you see the jail, Capitol, and post office</p> <p>Dinner</p> <p>Evening Program* "Storyteller" – Experience 18th-century African American stories while participating in a dynamic performance with costumed interpreters</p> <p>Return to hotel</p>	<p>Breakfast</p> <p>Depart for Charlottesville, VA</p> <p>Monticello Tour Thomas Jefferson's plantation home as well as the grounds and gardens where he cultivated hundreds of different fruits and vegetables</p> <p>Michie Tavern Tour this historic tavern built in 1784 and enjoy a meal of traditional 18th-century-style fare. Discuss 18th-century Virginia with costumed guides and servers</p> <p>Lunch</p> <p>Ashlawn/Highland Visit the home of our fifth President, James Monroe, and learn about 19th-century life through examples of early American and Victorian architecture and craft demonstrations</p> <p>University of Virginia Explore Jefferson's Academical Village as you visit the Rotunda and the Lawn</p> <p>Return to Williamsburg, VA</p> <p>Dinner</p> <p>Return to hotel</p>	<p>Breakfast</p> <p>Yorktown Victory Center Learn about life in Virginia during the Revolutionary War, from a Continental Army Encampment, galleries, and farmstead</p> <p>Yorktown Battlefields Drive to Surrender Field, the actual location where the British surrendered to General Washington's army, probably the most decisive event of the American Revolution. Walk to Cornwallis' cave on the riverfront and through the town where there are still 18th-century musket balls in some houses</p> <p>Lunch</p> <p>Plantation Visit Visit with soldiers and civilians from Civil War Virginia at Endview, or visit Shirley Plantation, the oldest in Virginia, and one of many plantations located along the historic James River</p> <p>Dinner</p> <p>Evening Program* "In Defense of Liberty" – In this interactive program, students learn of the struggles of being in the Continental Army and discuss the role of women in the Army Return to hotel</p>	<p>Breakfast</p> <p>Hotel check-out</p> <p>The Virginia Living Museum Learn about the plants and animals that were encountered by Captain John Smith and the other colonists that arrived in Jamestown in 1607.
